



FILM DOCUMENTARI IN LINGUA ORIGINALE



See eye-opening current events documentaries free at the **EYES WIDE OPEN** film series presented by U.S. Citizens for Peace & Justice - Rome



Our 2016-2017 season starts off on **October 20th** with:

Gun Nation (U.S./UK, 2016) -- Director Zed Nelson offers a gripping portrait of America's unending love affair with personal firearms, by interviewing the gun owners he photographed 18 years ago for his award-winning book of the same name. A chilling but incisive look into the mentality marking much of U.S. culture. "In *Gun Nation*, the people are at least as scary as the weapons." – N.Y. Times.

Nov. 3: *Where to invade next* (US, 2015), Michael

Nov. 17: *Terminal F, Chasing Edward Snowden*



(DK 2015, John Goetz) How Edward Snowden managed to escape the huge manhunt set up to capture him when he fled the U.S. to Hong Kong and then to Moscow. More than a documentary, the film is a genuine thriller – and "a useful sequel to *Citizenfour*" – *Film Sufi*. (58")

Dec. 1: *The Wanted 18* (Canada/Palestine 2014, Amer



Shomali) Mixing humorous animation with live action, the film shows the power of nonviolent resistance in occupied Palestine. Villagers import 18 cows for their milk, but for Israel they're a security threat. Ingenuity is the villagers' response. "Mind-opening" - *Variety*. (75")

Dec. 15: *No film today* (Arcobaleno not available)

Our film series will start up again on January 19th, 2017, with the award-winning film "*13th*". It examines the plight of countless Black Americans, reduced to slavery and deprived of their right to vote...legally, because of a loophole in the 13th amendment. A must see. "Simmers with anger and burns with eloquence" - *LA Times*

Screenings are on **alternate Thursdays** at the **circolo ARCI Arcobaleno**, 1 Via Pullino

How to get there:

Metro: B line to the Garbatella stop; take the Via Pullino exit; go right to Piazza Albini; via Pullino continues on the other side; at n°1, at the end of the block, go down the steps into the ARCI/Arcobaleno clubroom.

Bus: 673 from San Giovanni or Colosseum, 715 from P.za Venezia, 23 from Trastevere.

Doors open at 7:30pm. Films begin at 8pm, followed by a brief discussion (in English but Italian can also be used). Drinks and a light dinner can be enjoyed while viewing. Films are in English or with English subtitles. **Most are first showings in Rome!**

Films are free (but small donations are welcome). Arcobaleno membership is €7 per year (valid for various discounts in Rome).
