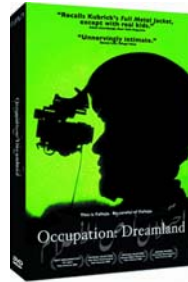

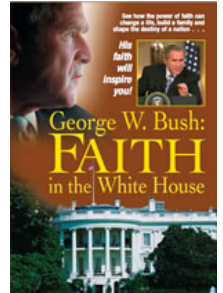
Oct 4 - **The Big Buy: Tom DeLay's Stolen Congress** (2006), the hot new film starring Houston's own Tom DeLay and a cast of Texans who stood up to DeLay's assault against democracy; directed by Texas filmmakers Mark Birnbaum and Jim Schermbeck; distributed by Robert Greenwald and Brave New Films.



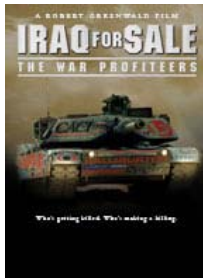
Oct 18 - **Occupation Dreamland** (2005), an unflinchingly candid portrait of a squad of American soldiers deployed in the doomed Iraqi city of Fallujah during the winter of 2004, a collective study of the soldiers unfolds as they patrol an environment of low-intensity conflict creeping steadily towards catastrophe; directed by Garrett Scott and Ian Olds.



Nov 1 - **Conservative Film Special, George W. Bush: Faith in the White House** (2004), billed as "*An Alternative to Fahrenheit 9/11*," examines the faith of President George W. Bush, how it impacts his decisions as the leader of the free world, how it has been unshakeable in dealing with 9/11, al-Qaeda and Iraq. Directed by David Balsiger.



Nov 15 - **Iraq For Sale: The War Profiteers** (2006) takes you inside the lives of soldiers, truck drivers, widows and children who have been changed forever as a result of profiteering in the reconstruction of Iraq. Uncovers the connections between private corporations making a killing and the decision makers who allow them to do so; directed by Robert Greenwald (Outfoxed, Wal-Mart)



Nov 29 - **Occupied Minds: A Palestinian-Israeli Journey Beyond Hope and Despair** (2005) takes viewers to ground zero of the dispute, the volatile streets of Gaza and Jerusalem, to hear the voices of both sides of the conflict, as seen by two journalists, Jamal Dajani, a Palestinian-American, and David Michaelis, an Israeli. Directed by Dajani and Michaelis themselves.



Dec 13 - **An Inconvenient Truth** (2006), eloquently weaves the science of global warming with Al Gore's personal history and lifelong commitment to reversing the effects of global climate change, presents a wide array of facts and information in a thoughtful and compelling way, not a story of despair but rather a rallying cry, directed by Davis Guggenheim



Films begin at 7pm, followed by a brief **discussion** and (for those who wish to join) **pizza afterwards**.
