The protest in front of the U.S. Embassy aims to inform the Bush Administration, via our Ambassador, of three simple facts that they seem not to realize: -- the war is destroying innocent lives: our kids' and untold numbers of Iraqis', -- the war is worsening our security, -- the war is busting our economy. **THE OCCUPATION MUST END!**

We have tried to convey these simple facts to Ambassador Spogli in seven letters sent over the past year and a half: he has never deigned to answer. And lately the top U.S. diplomat in Italy has been using his influence for anything but diplomacy, from the letter to the Italian government urging increased troop levels in Afghanistan to pressuring the Italian government to approve the new U.S. military base in Vicenza.
